THEMSA MISSIONARY PROJECTS

Driven by the love for mission and saving souls, the Theology and Missions Students of Valley View University embark on regular evangelistic efforts in different communities in Ghana. Through these, we have encountered individuals and communities with critical social and spiritual needs, which, if attended to, could lead many to Christ. These include the need for an Adventist School in **Sanguli** (Tatale District of the Northern Region), a church building at **Wawaso** (Kadjebi District of the Oti Region), and the present truth for the **post-modern youth** in universities, colleges and high schools in Ghana.

Backed by our patrons and university, we have resolved to lead in organizing funds, voluntary services, and support to implement the following projects to serve these needs:

- 1. A Basic School in Sanguli, starting with the Preschool block at the cost of GHS 20,000
- 2. A church building project at Wawaso (capacity: 120 people)² at the cost of GHS 70,000
- 3. THEMSA Media Ministry (targeting the tech-savvy youth) at the cost of GHS 29,300

Anticipated Impact: We anticipate:

- a. educating and unleashing all potentials of the kids of the Sanguli community to serve humanity.
- b. revealing Jesus to the children of Sanguli and their families through Adventist education
- c. providing a convenient place of worship, fellowship, and Christian nurturing to the people of Wawaso to induce church growth and community development
- d. reaching 500, 000 unreached youth with the gospel and the Advent message yearly.³
- e. spiritual and socio-economic growth of the church in Ghana and beyond through the influence of the products of the Sanguli school and converts of the media ministry and Wawaso church
- f. assisting ministerial training with the platform to use the skills learnt during their training.
